God's Good Answers to Kids' Tough Questions

Why Children Ask Questions

- Asking questions is a way that children learn.
 - The pre-school child (age 4-5) is a questioner.
 - The primary age child (age 6-8) learns by observing and watching.
 - The junior age child (age 9-11) is an investigator.
 - The young teen (age 12-14) is beginning to establish his or her belief system.
- Children ask questions because they are curious.
- ▶ People often asked Jesus questions.

Guidelines for Answering Questions

- ▶ Seek the Lord's wisdom and guidance before answering a child's question.
 - Say a quick prayer for God's wisdom and understanding as the child is asking you a question.
 - Answer the question in your first sentence.
 - Follow the answer with a brief explanation backed with Scripture.
 This gives the child the biblical backing and authority of the answer.
 - If you don't know the answer, tell the child that his question is important and you will try to find the answer.
- Answer the child's question in a simple and honest way.
 - Treat each child's question in a serious manner.
 - After answering the child's question, ask him an open-ended question about the topic.
 - Never embarrass a child about a question he has asked.

- Listen carefully to each child who talks with you.
 - Careful listening shows the child you care.
 - When children know you care they are more apt to be honest in the future regarding other needs and problems.
- ▶ Remember the child's age when answering a question.
 - Children ask questions from their own limited understanding so avoid giving adult answers.
 - Answer the question in a way that will satisfy the child's understanding yet is the truth.
- ▶ Seek advice and help from other sources if necessary.
 - Your pastor
 - Mature Christians
